Advanced Placement Student Manual









Overview

The Advanced Placement (AP) Program is a series of subjects in different disciplines designed to give you a college-level experience. With AP you will be challenged academically in the areas of your interest. Universities use your performance in AP classes as an indicator of your readiness for college work, therefore, the importance of taking an AP class in high school. You can also earn college credit by performing well in the AP exam given yearly by College Board. Everybody in an AP class at MUIDS will have the opportunity to take this exam at our school. The exam is taken by not just MUIDS students but also students from the US and other international schools around the world. With the result of your AP exam you can know how well you are doing compared to all AP students. Lastly, you can earn Honors and Awards granted by College Board based on your performance. MUIDS will offer four AP subjects for the 12th grade in year 2019-2020: AP Calculus AB, AP English Literature and Composition, AP Computer Science A and AP 2-D Art and Design.

Taking an AP subject demands hard work and patience. The AP Student Manual is a guide for MUIDS students with all the information there is to know about the AP subjects in the school.

Other factors that may be considered in a student's application include:

- Attendance records (minimum attendance records may apply)
- Reports of academic misconduct (see MUIDS Student Manual)
- Disciplinary actions that have resulted in suspension or dismissal of any group or program within MUIDS
- Recommendations from MUIDS teachers

After verification of student requirements, the school releases a list of confirmed students to be enrolled in AP classes at MUIDS. Confirmation of enrollment is subject to change upon school-wide scheduling, seats available and the order in which students submit their application/participation agreement.

The AP Participation Agreement

The Advanced Placement program is designed to make students grow and show their full potential in college-level classes. Therefore, taking an AP class requires specific commitments from students, parents and MUIDS to make the class a true reflection of the abilities of our students. An agreement between students, parents and MUIDS teachers and administrators is signed to ensure that all necessities are satisfied to make the AP classes a positive experience for the students. Parents, students and MUIDS have a unique responsibility in the AP classes as described below:

The AP Exam

The AP exam is a requirement for all AP subjects at MUIDS. For exceptional performances in the AP exams, there are honors and awards given to students by College Board (see section below). In class, part of the work will be assigned to prepare students for the exams. Students will have an opportunity to practice a mock test at least once before the AP exam in May. Each subject has its own test, and their dates and times are as follows:

After administered at MUIDS, the exams are then sent to College Board. Final scores are sent to students in the summer (usually July). The format of the exams is summarized in the table below:

- 15 digital images that include works of art and design and process documentation.
- Typed responses to prompts, providing information about the questions that guided their investigation and how they practiced, experimented, and revised, guided by their questions.
- 2. Selected Works (40% of exam score)

Students will submit works of art and design and writing to demonstrate skillful synthesis of materials, processes, and ideas. 5 physical works or high-quality reproductions of physical works with written responses on paper describing the materials, processes, and ideas used.

The scores place a student's proficiency in the subject on a scale of 5 points:

Honors and Awards

There are several AP Awards from College Board that a student could be eligible to receive upon performance in AP exams. These awards are the recognition to those students who show a distinctive performance in one or more exams and they can be cited in the student's credentials and resume.

Earning College Credit

If you earn an AP score of 3 or higher, it is highly probable that you are eligible to earn college credit, advanced placement or both in an international college abroad. Almost all US colleges and universities grant credit for AP scores, as well as many other institutions in more than 60 other countries.

College credit is not determined by MUIDS, the College Board or the AP program. Every university has its own set of policies regarding the



Credit Recovery

- In the case of a failing score in an AP subject, the student is expected to follow the school-wide or departmental policies for Credit Recovery.
- In the case that MUIDS does not have a clear policy in place for failing subjects, the Credit Recovery of an AP subject will be designed at the discretion of AP teachers and their respective departments.

Student Conduct

- All AP students will follow MUIDS rules on discipline and academic conduct.
- Students are required to attend class on a regular basis according to the school rules.
- Academic honesty is expected from every AP student. In the case of academic misconduct and/or plagiarism in any AP assignments, disciplinary action will be undertaken according to the disciplinary policies of MUIDS. Parents may be contacted or suspension may be applied as needed at the discretion and recommendation of AP teachers, Department Heads and the School's Administrators.
- In the case of academic misconduct, including (but are not limited to) plagiarism or academic dishonesty in Exams or Projects, the AP

• The AP Exam Fee will not be reimbursed in the case of a dismissal from an AP class or exam.

Adding, Dropping and Changing AP Subjects

- Students can only add an AP class by the application process described at the beginning of this manual. Exceptions may be students who join MUIDS after the academic year has started.
- Enrollment in an AP subject is subject to academic requirements,
 and the seats available in the class.
- On rare instances, a student may be allowed to drop an AP class based on proven lack of performance and based on the recommendations of AP teachers and department heads.
- In the case above, the AP Exam Fee will not be reimbursed to the student.
